

Community works together on 'Welcome to Walker' signs

The new "Welcome to Walker" signs on both the north and south directions of Highway 371 that stand as an artistic and decorative gateway to Walker, show what a community can accomplish when members work together with a common goal in mind.

The entire process took approximately 2.5 years, and was completed at no cost to taxpayers. The sign committee, consisting of Amy Jones and Andy Bednarczyk, Lynn Mineer and Dale Jones, obtained the permits and came up with a design.

The \$13,000 cost for the signs was covered by Dale and Harriet Jones. Lynn Mineer of Mineer Signs built the Western Red cedar signs and painted them at cost. Loren Hein of Turf Technology did the landscaping work at cost; and Andersen Brothers provided landscaping rocks and soil.

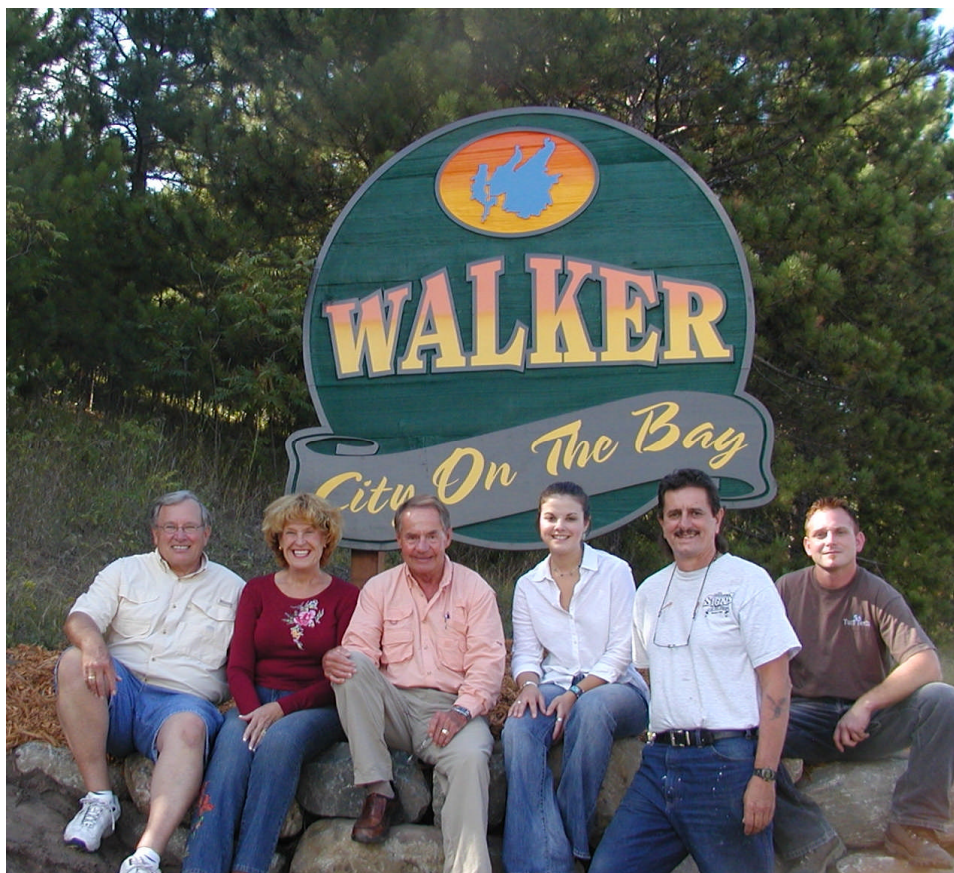
